PROTOCOL FOR TESTING AND QUARANTINE OF EXPOSED INDIVIDUALS WHO COME IN CONTACT WITH A COVID-19 POSITIVE PERSON

CONTACT DESCRIPTION	IMMEDIATE ACTION	TESTING PROCEDURE	QUARANTINE/ISOLATION	TREATMENT PROCESS
<p>HIGH RISK CONTACT(S) - those who have come in contact with a Covid-19 positive person without wearing protective gear (mask) and had an exposure of more than 15 minutes in close proximity (less than 1 meter) of the positive person</p>	<p>1. Do not panic.</p> <p>2. Self-isolate wherever you are (at home or institution). Ensure no further exposure with anybody.</p> <p>3. Immediately identify people you came into close contact with, who can be your high risk contacts. Alert them as well as IDSP by calling on 108/District Helpline Number.</p> <p>4. The person(s) who have symptoms (symptomatic)</p>	<p>Based on the date of exposure, rapid antigen testing or RT-PCR will be done on the high risk contacts. The type and timing of test to be conducted will be decided by the hospital authorities (if within the hospital premises) or the IDSP team of NHM (if outside the hospital premises)</p>	<p>1. Till results are declared, all high risk contacts will undergo home quarantine and strictly follow the three recommended health protocol of hand washing or sanitising frequently, maintaining social distancing, and wearing mask.</p> <p>2. Once results are declared and if tested negative, the following measures are to be taken:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • home quarantine for 14 days • following the three recommended health practices • monitor their health on a daily basis • report about any 	<p>If tested positive,</p> <p>1. Category A (asymptomatic) and Category B (mild symptoms) persons will continue with home quarantine of 14 days during which they will have to follow the measures given below:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • follow the three recommended health practices • monitor their health on a daily basis • follow toilet protocol • report about any symptoms developed even if mild <p><i>In case there is no facility for home quarantine, the patient may be kept in the community or institutional quarantine centre</i></p>

Positive low-risk individuals will be under medical team's observation at institutional quarantine and shifted to hospital if required. Discharge from institutional quarantine will be as specified above after two consecutive RT-PCR tests, 24 hours apart, are reported negative.</p>
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NOTE:-

- * **Category A Patients:-** Can be asymptomatic even if exposed to the virus or may have come in contact with a positive patient/person. Such individuals can be treated at home through isolation.
- * **Category B Patients:-** May have mild symptoms (fever/other symptoms) and may not require hospitalisation. Such individuals can be treated at home through isolation.
- * **Category C patients:-** Patients with breathing difficulty and fever requiring oxygen support. Such individuals need to be admitted and treated in a hospital set up.

* **Category D patients:-** Patients with severe COVID-19 symptoms requiring ventilation support. Such individuals need to be admitted in dedicated COVID hospitals.

* **High Risk Contacts of COVID-19 positive person:-** Those who have come in contact with a Covid-19 positive person without wearing protective gear (mask) and had an exposure of more than 15 minutes in close proximity (less than 1 meter) of the positive person.

* **Low Risk Contacts of COVID-19 positive person:-** Low risk contacts are those who are either secondary contacts or primary contacts who were not exposed to a COVID-positive patient directly (by wearing a mask and maintaining physical distancing) and had an exposure of less than 15 minutes.

* The responsibility for contact tracing, testing and quarantine process will be handled by IDSP team under NHM.

* Treatment process comes under the aegis of the treatment clinical management committee headed by DHS (MI) in collaboration with all hospitals.
