

## PROTOCOL FOR PEOPLE ENTERING MEGHALAYA FROM OUTSIDE THE NORTH-EASTERN REGION

<p>1. All people coming from outside the state should pre-register themselves on <a href="http://meghalayonline.gov.in/covid/selfregistration">http://meghalayonline.gov.in/covid/selfregistration</a>.</p> <p>2. Those who have not pre-registered themselves should be registered at the entry point through the Web App (<a href="https://coronamegh.cdfi.co.in">https://coronamegh.cdfi.co.in</a>)</p>	<p>1. All persons who enter the State at the designated entry points will be scanned by an infrared thermometer or thermal scanner to detect body temperature</p> <p>2. All persons who come from High Risk areas where the transport is facilitated by the State shall be tested by Rapid Antibody Test Kits and RT-PCR. 'Pool testing' method would be used, and if pooled test is positive, the individual sample retesting to be by RT-PCR/CBNAAT.</p> <p>3. The persons shall be kept in institutional quarantine in the respective districts until test results arrive. In case of space constraints, they shall be sent for home quarantine after sampling.</p> <p>4. Those coming in private vehicles to the State from outside of North East Region of India shall be sampled for RT PCR at the entry point District and sent</p>	<p>1. All people coming from outside the state should mandatorily undergo home quarantine for 14 days, using the Home Quarantine Diary.</p> <p>2. Additional 14 days of self-reporting would be done by them. During this period also, they should remain indoors. If they require any emergency movement, they should wear a mask and follow the three commandments given in the Self-Reporting Diary.</p> <p>3. Those under home quarantine will be monitored by:</p> <p>a). District Surveillance Team</p> <p>b). Community COVID Management Team.</p>	<p>1. People under home quarantine should enter their daily health status in the diary provided.</p> <p>2. They can also enter the health status of their family members in this diary</p> <p>3. If they find any symptoms for themselves or their family members, they shall report to 108 or contact District Helpline number given in the diary.</p>	<p>1. The designated monitoring team setup by the respective Districts (any selected members of CCMT) will visit those under quarantine on a daily basis. This team will use a Web App (<a href="https://coronamegh.cdfi.co.in">https://coronamegh.cdfi.co.in</a>) which is GPS enabled, thus helping in tracking the movement of the monitoring team and ensuring that they visit all the houses allotted to them.</p> <p>2. All those who are under quarantine and symptomatic shall be tested through RT-PCR.</p> <p>3. The monitoring team will also assess the psychological state of those under home quarantine and ensure counselling support.</p> <p>4. While monitoring for COVID symptoms the team should also check for any other viral infections such Measles-Rubella, SARI, ILI like symptoms.</p> <p>5. The data from this App will be used for analysis at the district and the state levels on a daily basis.</p> <p>6. The phone numbers of all those entering the State shall be put for geo-fencing and an SMS warning will be sent to those who break the quarantine.</p>	<p>1. Persons who develop any COVID-19 symptoms in the 14 days quarantined period would be tested using RT-PCR test</p> <p>2. Those of who test positive shall be handled as per the patient handling protocol of the Government of Meghalaya.</p>

	<p>for home quarantine.</p> <p>5. Sampling can be done either at quarantine/CCCs or at facilities as designated by the Districts.</p> <p>6, a. If the Test result is negative, they shall be sent home for quarantine.</p> <p>b. If the test result is positive, the protocol dtd 28<sup>th</sup> March shall be followed.</p>				
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
